### ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

In order to participate in a GT Group Study Abroad Program, there are certain eligibility requirements you must meet. GT will check your records to confirm that you meet these overall requirements, please refer to the Eligibility Handout at [http://www.oie.gatech.edu/sa/forms/pdfs/mat\\_eligibility.pdf](http://www.oie.gatech.edu/sa/forms/pdfs/mat_eligibility.pdf) for a complete listing of all eligibility requirements:

1. **You must be in good academic standing.** Academic standing is determined by the Registrar's Office each semester (*students on academic warning are still eligible, students on PROBATION are not*).
2. **You must be in good disciplinary standing with the Office of the Dean of Students.**
3. **You must maintain appropriate standards of behavior.** Keep in mind that there are social aspects to the study abroad learning experience. Faculty, staff, and participants, must be able to comply with program guidelines including but not limited to the following: the ability to interact, work and effectively communicate within both group and independent settings, the ability to live and travel in a close group environment, the ability to live in program-provided housing (eg. university residence/dormitory, host family, and/or hotel, etc. depending on the program), travel by bus/train/plane with the group, attend and participate in all classes, participate in cultural activities and site visits, etc. Please note: If you have had previous contact with GT study abroad programs, the OIE, and/or the Office of the Dean of Students, applications may require additional time to be reviewed and processed.
4. **You must be at least 18 years of age by the program departure date and you must have completed at least two semesters of college-level study prior to participation in study abroad.**
5. **You must complete TWO Mandatory OIE Prep Meetings.** Each time you participate in a GT group study abroad program, you are required to complete the Summer/GTL/Pacific/Arch SYP Prep Meetings: **PART ONE & PART TWO**.

**Please note:** Your Program Director may have other requirements which are above and beyond GT's general requirements. *You will no longer be eligible to participate in a study abroad program if you fall out of good standing after applying for or being accepted into a program.*

# HOW TO BEGIN

## 1. COMPLETE THE PART ONE ONLINE MEETING:

GT Students should complete the **Mandatory PART ONE Meeting ONLINE** – This is required of all GT students applying to a Summer group program, the undergrad programs at GTL, the Spring Pacific Program, or the ARCH Senior Year in Paris Program. PART ONE provides students with information that they will need to apply and to begin preparing to go abroad.

## 2. APPLY ONLINE TO OIE:

Students who wish to be considered for GT Summer group programs, GTL undergrad programs, the Pacific Program, or ARCH SYP should complete the **GT Study Abroad Online Application Form** at [www.oie.gatech.edu/apply](http://www.oie.gatech.edu/apply) and then **submit the required supporting materials** to the OIE either in person or by regular mail; faxes cannot be accepted since original signatures are required.

## 3. NOT A GT STUDENT?

If you are a Non-GT (**Transient/Special**) student, you are required to submit TWO separate applications to the OIE. Please go to [www.oie.gatech.edu/transient](http://www.oie.gatech.edu/transient) for details.

## 4. CONTACT THE PROGRAM:

If you have not yet spoken to the Program Director/Coordinator of the program to which you will apply about academic requirements and other program-specific information, you are strongly encouraged to do so. The program is the best source for information about: 1) Course pre-requisites, 2) Transportation to and from study abroad site(s); transportation while abroad, 3) Housing arrangements, 4) Program fees/cost of program, 5) Payment schedule for program fees, 6) Refund/Cancellation policies for program fees.

## APPLICATION FAQ

1) Am I eligible to apply for GT Summer Programs, GTL, the Pacific Program, or ARCH SYP? Please see PAGE 1 of this packet..

2) Can I apply for more than one program?

**No.** You may only apply for one program at a time for a particular semester. If you are not accepted to your program of choice, then you may reapply to another program for the same term. You should contact the OIE to have your application transferred.

3) Where do I submit my completed application and supporting materials?

The Application form should be submitted online and supporting materials should be submitted either in person or by mail to the OIE, located in the Savant Building, Suite 211. **Your application will not be reviewed until all items have been received in OIE.**

4) What happens to my application after I turn it in to the OIE?

After OIE receives your online application form AND other required items, your academic record and your disciplinary record will be checked to ensure that you are in "good standing." Your application will be sent to the Program Director for review and approval. *The Program Director/Coordinator and OIE reserve the right to interview candidates if it is determined that more information is needed.*

- 5) How long will it take to find out if I have been accepted into a program or not?  
 OIE begins processing completed applications after October 15<sup>th</sup>. Students are welcome to submit applications before October 15<sup>th</sup>; these applications will be held until the processing cycle begins. OIE begins mailing out acceptance/denial letters after November 1<sup>st</sup>. It takes approximately 3 weeks to review and approve a completed application (you must submit your official transcript and program deposit before OIE can review your application and forward it to the Program). *Processing times may take longer than 3 weeks under certain circumstances. For example, if you have a disciplinary file with Student Affairs it is likely that your application will take longer than 3 weeks to process, etc.*
- 6) Are applications accepted on a rolling basis?  
 Applications are accepted on a rolling basis until programs are filled by eligible and qualified applicants. Exceptions: Mod Arch & Mod City, Grad Program: Director makes decisions after receiving all apps; Japanese LBAT: Decisions are based on 1<sup>st</sup> chapter test results for JAPN 2002 -late Feb (applicants must earn at least 80% to qualify). Hist of Art & Arch in Italy & Greece: Decisions based on merit and year of classification.
- 7) What about GT's "36 - Hour Rule," can I study abroad during my final 36 hours?  
 Credits earned on GT study abroad are considered in residence, so you can go abroad on a GT Program during your final 36 hours.
- 8) Can I take classes offered on the Atlanta campus during the same semester that I am studying abroad?  
**NO**, students cannot take Atlanta courses during the semester that they study abroad (this includes independent study and research hours). **Students may only register for the courses officially offered by the GT study abroad program.**
- 9) Can I participate in more than one GT Study Abroad Program?  
 Yes! However, you may not participate in more than one program during the same semester.
- 10) Can I participate in the same program more than once?  
**NO**, students may only participate in a program one time.
- 11) Can I go abroad if I am a Co-op Student?  
 Yes, but only during a school semester when you would be taking classes.
- 12) Are there any meetings that I am required to attend/complete?  
**YES! THERE ARE TWO MANDATORY MEETINGS OFFERED BY OIE FOR SUMMER, GTL, PACIFIC, AND ARCH SYP!!** Participants are required to complete these **Mandatory meetings: PART ONE and PART TWO** (see page 4 for details). Programs will also have required Program Specific Meetings - contact your program directly for details (see contacts, page 9).
- 13) What happens if I cannot attend/complete one of the scheduled Mandatory Meetings?  
 PART ONE and PART TWO Meetings are required of all participants. The PART ONE meeting is offered online, and you must attend a scheduled PART TWO MEETING. If you fail to complete either PART ONE or PART TWO before your program, you will not be allowed to participate. *If you are a **transient/special** or a **co-op student**, the OIE will e-mail the materials to you in November for Spring programs, and in March for Summer and Fall programs. **If your e-mail address changes for any reason, you must contact OIE as soon as possible to update your information.*** Co-op students are responsible for informing OIE that they will be on co-op by emailing [study.abroad@oie.gatech.edu](mailto:study.abroad@oie.gatech.edu), transients/specials will automatically receive this information electronically.
- 14) How much does it cost to study abroad?  
 Refer to [www.oie.gatech.edu/sa/programs](http://www.oie.gatech.edu/sa/programs) for cost info, or contact your program directly. Please note that "Program Fees" DO NOT include GT tuition. **GT tuition for study abroad courses and program fees must be paid directly to the GT Bursar's office.** All participants in study abroad programs pay in-state tuition + the \$103 GT Technology Fee. **Out-of-state students** pay an additional \$250\* as an out-of-state fee.  
 \* The GTL out-of-state fee is \$2,000.
- 15) Are there scholarships and/or financial aid for study abroad?  
 OIE provides information on scholarships and financial aid to degree-seeking GT students. In most cases, GT students use their financial aid toward the cost of GT study abroad. And, YES! There are scholarships for degree-seeking GT students to study abroad. GT degree-seeking students will receive more information in the online PART ONE meeting. - 16) I am an international student, what about my status while abroad?  
 International students at U.S. colleges/universities should make an appointment on their home campus with an International Student Advisor regarding their status while participating in study abroad with GT.

**MANDATORY PREP MEETINGS – PART ONE & PART TWO**  
***The Prep Meetings are required for applicants to Summer group programs, GTL undergrad programs, the Pacific Program, & ARCH SYP.***

⇒ To be eligible you are required to complete **TWO** OIE Prep Meetings:

**PART TWO – You must attend, see dates below.**

**1) PART ONE: approximately one hour online:**

- **PART ONE is the first required OIE Prep Meeting.**
- You should try to complete this requirement as soon as you submit an application to OIE.
- You should complete the Part One Meeting online:  
[http://www.oie.gatech.edu/sa/part\\_one\\_meeting/](http://www.oie.gatech.edu/sa/part_one_meeting/).
- PART ONE covers the following topics: Application basics, financial aid, Passports/visas, Insurance Information, Scholarships, Payment Information, Academic and Non-Academic Misconduct, Eligibility, Registration, Etc.
- After reviewing the online documents, you will be asked to complete a series of online quizzes. Successful completion of the quizzes fulfills your PART ONE requirement.
- OIE receives your name electronically upon the completion of the online meeting. Students who fail to complete the PART ONE Prep Meeting online will not be permitted to participate in a GT study abroad program, even if they have met all other requirements and have been accepted.

**2) PART TWO: two hours (you must attend only ONE of these meetings):**

- **PART TWO is the second required OIE Prep Meeting.**
- PART TWO OIE Prep Meetings will be held in November for the Pacific Program and Spring at GTL and in March for summer programs, Fall at GTL, and the ARCH Senior Year in Paris Program
- PART TWO topics include: Safety, GT Policies and Procedures related to discipline, Health Matters, Sexual Harassment, Emergencies, Staying in touch while overseas, Cross-Cultural Communication and Adaptation, Money, Etc.
- OIE will take attendance at the PART TWO Prep Meetings. Students who fail to come to one of the PART TWO Prep Meetings will not be permitted to participate in a GT study abroad program, even if they have met all other requirements and have been accepted.

# APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS/CHECKLIST

## HOW TO COMPLETE YOUR STUDY ABROAD APPLICATION

- 1. Submit the Online Application Form:** After reading these instructions, go to <http://www.oie.gatech.edu/apply> and complete the Study Abroad Online Application Form.
- 2. Mail Additional Items to OIE (this will complete your application):** After submitting the online form, you must complete your study abroad application by mailing the items listed below to OIE. Faxed or electronic copies are not acceptable. Keep a photocopy of your entire application packet for your personal records. **Your application cannot be reviewed until all items have been received.**
- 3. (NON-GT) Transient/Special students:** you must also download and complete the **Transient/Special Application for Admission** at [www.oie.gatech.edu/transient](http://www.oie.gatech.edu/transient) and mail it to OIE with the study abroad items listed below.

### ADDITIONAL APPLICATION ITEMS #1 – 4

#### **ITEM ONE - OFFICIAL Transcript(s)**

OIE cannot accept “unofficial transcripts;” unofficial transcripts have no identifying information on them.

**Graduate or undergraduate GT students** should submit official GT transcript(s). For more information on requesting transcripts, please visit: [www.registrar.gatech.edu](http://www.registrar.gatech.edu). **\*\*If you are a GT first semester freshman applicant, you do not need to submit transcripts; you do not have GT grades yet, so this will be waived.**

**Undergraduates who transferred to GT** and have attended GT for *only one semester* should **also attach an official transcript from their previous institution.** If the program to which you are applying has specific course prerequisites, you should submit all transcripts necessary to show that you have met those prerequisites.

**Transients/Specials or others who are not currently GT students** should submit an official transcript from the current or most recent institution. If you are applying to GT as a Transient Student for study abroad, and you are a **first semester college student** please submit official high school transcripts. **Additionally, Transients who are first semester college students at the time of application are required to later submit a college transcript directly to GT Admissions as soon as the first semester of college is completed. See the Transient application for more details.**

#### **ITEM TWO –Deposit Receipt**

*Deposit amounts vary by program and are listed online at the GT payment system – see below for the link.*

Study Abroad Programs require a non-refundable deposit to be submitted at the time of application. The deposit must be submitted online to the GT Bursar through the GT online payment system located at: [https://epay.gatech.edu/C20793\\_ustores/web/store\\_main.jsp?STOREID=44](https://epay.gatech.edu/C20793_ustores/web/store_main.jsp?STOREID=44)

Once you have paid your deposit online, please print out the confirmation/receipt page and submit it to OIE. Your application cannot be processed if you do not provide a deposit receipt at the time of application.

**PLEASE NOTE: PROGRAM DEPOSITS ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.** *This means that if for any reason you drop out of the program, you would not be entitled to have your deposit money returned.*

All IP participants must develop proficiency in a non-English language. The International Plan provides two options for meeting the language requirement: 1) the Foreign Language Option and 2) the English Language Option. In order to meet the requirement with the Foreign Language Option, you must take the ACTFL proficiency exam and score at the minimum level outlined at [www.modlangs.gatech.edu](http://www.modlangs.gatech.edu). No coursework is required when choosing this option but one should expect to possess a high level of proficiency. For advice about the possible paths for reaching this level of proficiency, see Dr. Bettina Cothran in the School of Modern Languages. The English Language Option allows for the language requirement to be met upon completion of a 2002 course in the chosen foreign language with a grade of B, or better, or demonstrated equivalence of said completion. Option 2 is intended for those students who, though they will have been abroad for at least 26 wks, participated in programs not allowing for extensive use of the IP language selected (i.e. 26 wks study/work/research abroad in English-speaking countries). The decision as to which option to choose should be made in consultation with major IP faculty rep.
